## **Collective Worship**

This week we have been learning about the life of Moses.

Our candle time focus was Exodus 34:29-35. In this passage Moses had just received the Ten Commandments from God on Mt Sinai and his meeting with God transfigures him. Moses' face radiates God's glory which frightens the people. This story suggests that humans can be changed by being in the presence of God.

We considered the questions: *Are there times when you have felt awe and wonder at something amazing? Can you describe them?* It has been wonderful to hear the children share thoughtful responses to these questions and a reminder on these grey and chilly days, of the wonder all around us if we just take a moment to pause and reflect.
