Message from Mrs Holland

Eco Schools Green Flag Award Update

It was fantastic to find out that our highest score was for Global Citizenship, but we scored poorly on Healthy Living, Energy, and School Grounds. With these results in mind, the Eco Committee put together an Action Plan:

Litter: To eradicate litter from lunches and snacks within the school grounds by providing extra bins in areas prone to littering.

Healthy Living: To encourage families to try meat free recipes at home by including vegetarian recipes in the school newsletter.

Waste: To reduce the volume of fruit and vegetable matter going into the black bins by obtaining a compost bin for the school grounds.

We hope that everyone will do their bit to help us improve in these areas!

The recipe chosen by the Eco Committee for this week's newsletter is a Vegetarian Bolognese - we hope you will encourage your children to try this delicious recipe by making at home.

Safer Internet Day

We have all taken part in activities linked to Safer Internet Day this week.

Hedgehog Class read 'Chicken Clicking' by Jeanne Willis & Tony Ross, and listened to the song too.

Badger Class read "Hanni and the Magic Window": a perfect way to kick-start conversations about life online. We focussed on recognising the many positive uses of technology but also recognising when to get help with a worry or concern. The children had the opportunity to work in small groups and express how different scenarios might make them feel, and who would be the best person to talk to. Badger Class also discussed how to use the internet responsibly and be a good friend online.

Owl Class had visited this topic just before Christmas in preparation for those technology gifts. On Thursday this we week, we spent some time revisiting staying safe whilst using devices and appropriate etiquette when using social platforms. I was so impressed with their understanding and knowing of who to tell if they see or hear anything that is not appropriate. Well done Owls! Many had a good understanding about privacy settings and the importance of not sharing information or photos that disclose where you live or go to school. We discussed age limits for the host of different sites available for communication and realised that only Mrs Pickering was old enough to use them! Owls, you showed an excellent understanding of using the internet safely and appropriately and what to do if you have concerns- please make sure you implement this knowledge and stay safe. Technology is wonderful if used correctly.

In **Falcon Class** they read a book all about online safety. They also celebrated all the great things about being online but made sure to remind themselves how they can stay safe. Our activity focused on the things we may do on the internet that we may think are harmless but that actually we need to "think before doing."
