The children were particularly fascinated by the models she brought in to share, and the real horse tooth demonstrating the consequences of one too many sugar lumps!

As I write this newsletter, the children are just about to embark on another exciting 'house' day, visiting four different Science activities in mixed age year groups. The children always respond so positively to working with the full range of peers from Year R to 6 and these days have a lovely school community feel to them. Our theme this week is forgiveness. We pondered the question: "What might we use to mend a broken friendship?" and shared the parable of The Unforgiving Servant.

At the end of the Bible story Jesus tells us that, if we have done something wrong, we need to say sorry to God and then he will forgive us. In a similar way, if you have fallen out with a friend, two things often need to happen: if you know you have done something wrong or upset someone, you need to be brave enough to say sorry to that person. Then the person to whom you have said sorry needs to forgive you. As members of our school community, we can apply our school values to situations like these. It takes **courage** to ask for forgiveness; **wisdom** and **love** help us to understand how to best respond to an apology and forgive.

Throughout the week the classes have had daily science activities which have included learning about famous scientists and were enthused by talks from visiting scientists.

The week finished with a house science day where the children carried out a different activity in each classroom. These included looking at fingerprints, sound and the environment.
