**Summer Reading Challenge** 

Join the Ready, Set, Read! team at your local library this summer West Berkshire Libraries are challenging primary age children to read up to six library books between 1 July and 15 September and collect FREE incentives for their achievements as they read – with medals and certificates for everyone who completes the challenge! From 1 July, children 4-11 years can visit a library to sign up for the Summer Reading Challenge. Developed by The Reading Agency in partnership with Youth Sport Trust, the theme of the challenge is 'Ready, Set, Read!' which aims to keep children's minds and bodies active over the summer break. Children will be able to join a superstar team and their marvellous mascots as they navigate a fictional summer obstacle course. School will return on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> September. Doors will open at 8.50 am and close for all year groups at 9:00. **We expect children to be in class by 8.55am** to provide time for them to settle in and start the day.

# **Equipment**

Every child needs a **named refillable water bottle**.

Children in **Years 1-6** need a **pencil case**. Please ensure their pencil cases are refilled ready for a new school year. These should remain at school and not be transported to and from the home. The pencil case needs to be able to fit in their drawer.

## They will need to contain:

## Pencil and colouring pencils, rubber, glue stick, pencil sharpener

They will also need **personal headphone buds or foldable earphones** that can fit in their drawer (Y1-Y6) to use with IT devices in school.

Children in **Years 1 to 4 will need a bookbag**. Please can we ask that children do not bring in a rucksack as we do not have enough room to store these in the classroom.

Children in **Years 5&6 can bring in a rucksack** as these are stored on the balcony.

Please ensure that everything is **labelled**. Our lost property container is often overflowing at the end of term!

If you are in receipt of free school meals (or have received free school meals at any point in the last 6 years) and need support in purchasing these items, please contact the school office.

We would much prefer it if **mobile phones were NOT brought into school**. As of September, we will ask that Upper KS2 children should only bring their phones into school if they are walking to school alone or walking home alone and they need to have them in case of an emergency. If your child fits the above criteria, please contact the office in September for a form. The form will need to be completed before the phone is brought by your child.
