Uniform Guidance

Purley Primary School students wear their uniform with pride. Our uniform shows that we are part of the Purley Primary School community. We have the highest expectations from our students with regards to school uniform and appearance, and strongly believe that our high standards promote positive behaviour, support effective teaching and learning and contribute to the ethos of the school.

School Uniform

We have school uniform and we encourage all our children to wear their uniform smartly. All items of uniform must be labelled. It consists of the following:

- Purple sweatshirt with a round neck and school logo or purple cardigan with a school logo
- White polo shirts for the Infants (Foundation to Year 2). White shirts/blouses for the Juniors (Year 3 upwards)
- It will not be a requirement to have polo shirts, shirts or blouses with a logo on
- Grey trousers or shorts for boys
- Grey skirts, trousers, shorts or pinafore for girls
- Purple gingham summer dresses
- Grey tights or white socks for girls. Grey socks for boys
- For P.E: house colour t-shirt, black shorts and black jogging bottoms, black pumps and/or trainers
- School shoes should be black as they are easily available for both boys and girls.
 For health and safety reasons, these should fit securely and have a low heel.
 Trainers, open toe sandals or boots will not be allowed. Long hair (boys and girls) should be tied back. Only stud earrings are permitted and they should be removed or taped up for PE lessons.

If a child does not have their PE kits they will miss PE lessons and a letter will be sent home.

General notes on appearance:

Shirts should be tucked in at all times.

Jewellery:

- The wearing of jewellery except watches and stud earrings is not permitted. Watches
 and earrings must be removed for PE and Games, earrings that cannot be removed
 will be covered with micro pore tape for the duration of the lesson (parents to
 provided tape)
- No other body piercing, i.e. nose piercings are allowed.



Hairstyles:

- Hair should be one natural colour, no hair dye.
- The style should be appropriate for school, hair should not obstruct pupil's vision.
- Pupils (boys and girls) with long hair must be tied back.
- Boys hair should be no shorter than Grade 2.
- Tramlines, patterns and sculpting is not allowed.

Students must not wear:

- Hoodies, sportswear or sweatshirts.
- Any kind of boots (wellingtons are allowed in wet weather/snow but must be changed when inside the school buildings).
- Trainers are NOT allowed to be worn at any time other than for PE lessons and clubs.
- Make up and nail varnish should NOT be worn to school.

Non-compliance with the uniform and appearance guidance:

Parents of students who do not wear the correct uniform, will be contacted and requested to bring in a change of clothes for their child.

Items of jewellery will be confiscated by the teacher to be collected by the parent.

Persistent and defiant non-compliance with the policy will result in an appropriate sanction which may include reflection or being sent home and absence recorded as unauthorised.
