Y1 have worked hard practising their cursive letters and we have started by looking at letters in the 2 o'clock family (c, a, d, g, g and s) Please refer to the handwriting booklet given out at the Greet the teacher meeting to help them practise further at home. The children are loving their Diddi Rugby session on Wednesday afternoons. Please ensure that all their uniform and PE kits are labelled. In science we have explored animals and looked at how scientists group animals. In maths Y1 have been counting forwards and backwards. Y2 have been comparing numbers to 100 and writing numerals in words. We finished our week with a fun music lesson where the children enjoyed using a variety of percussion instruments. What a great way to end a busy week!

Owl class authors will be composing and publishing these next week. Place value is still the focus for everyone in maths, the Cubes have extended to 3 digit number and the Spheres to 4-digit numbers. How do we get day and night? - This is the question that has been explored through science, I am sure your child will give you a wonderful explanation if you ask them! Our DT project is coming along well and the sewing has started. If you can spare an hour on Friday afternoons 2-3pm to help thread needles please do let the office know. #### **Falcon class**

Well, what a busy week we've had here in Falcon Class! The class are thoroughly enjoying 'Kensuke's Kingdom' in English and have used



drama outside to explore the changing feelings of the characters as they face their voyage round the world. Our blankets have come in handy making the shape of boats, to give that 'authentic' feel! The ideas have come thick and fast and next week these will feed into their 'ship's log' diary entry as Michael. Over in Maths we have continued to work more on Place Value (up to 10 million, depending on the group!) and considered aspects such as partitioning, recombining, ordering, comparing and rounding. These are key skills which underpin all the operations (addition etc.) so time has been well spent securing their skills.

In Geography we have explored longitude and latitude and considered how these are used to navigate - where would GPS be without them? Next week we move onto the difference between weather and climate, so perhaps have a look at our weather this weekend and see how it reflects our general

climate. In Science we have explored gravity in different ways: research using a clip from BBC Bitesize, investigation (ask about the rocks!) and drawing graphs to present results. I have been impressed in their children's use of key scientific vocabulary in their discussions. Well done to all of them!

I enjoyed meeting parents at our information evening this week, it was lovely to put some names to new faces as well as seeing familiar ones. I have recently received more information about the Residential trip and will send more information to the Y6 parents, as I mentioned in our meeting. Please continue to share the children's reading books with them and sign their Reading Journals, many thanks for doing so already.
