

#### **Breakfast & Nutkin Club**

Have you considered our Breakfast or After School Club? We are in the privileged position to offer school wrap around care at our school.

Breakfast Club runs each weekday morning from 8 - 8:50 AM

Nutkin Club runs each weekday afternoon from 3.15 – 6 PM

Perhaps this is not something you have looked into for your child. But, if you are rushing to work, working from home or have other commitments, you may find yourself overstretched.

At breakfast club the children enjoy their choice from a selection of cereals, toast, brioche and pancakes. There is then a choice of activities such as drawing, board games, construction toys and arts and crafts activities. They play alongside their friends until the start of the school day. At Nutkin club, the children are offered a wide range of recreational, social and creative activities, varying from day to day. They are also provided with a snack.

Bookings need to be made in advance, however, the school wraparound care is very flexible. You don't have to sign up for every day or every week. Just at times that suit you and your family.

Reggie decided to be a doctor and had to x-ray my arm to see what was wrong with it, and Darcie-Clare and Archie made funny faces using the Fuzzy Felt. In Geography we have used atlases to find out about the continents and oceans of the world. Y1 have worked on one more and one less in maths and Y2 have explored further representing numbers to 100

using base 10 to show the tens and units in a 2-digit number.

The school council hustings have taken place this week and I was extremely proud of all the children who prepared for this and showed the courage to stand up in front of their class and give their speeches. Well done to Scarlett and Wilf who were voted in as the Y2 representatives and George Bryan and Leyla as the Y1 representatives.

They've used facts from the text and inferred the opinions of the characters to add details that really engaged the reader. As we used Google Classroom, they were able to go back and edit several times to polish their final writing. Well done to them all! Over in Maths, all the groups have been honing their place value skills in their particular levels of challenge. The Hexagons enjoyed the context of the castle

dungeons when considering negative numbers! In Geography we have been constantly recapping longitude and latitude and using the atlases to consider climate zones, extreme climates and follow Michael's journey from our class book. Our chrome books came in handy again when researching facts such as hottest/driest/wettest places in the world. There were a few surprises-ask them about the driest place. Computer coding is in full swing and we enjoyed adding code and debugging to 'Splatty Bug' today. This will lead to children designing and writing their own code for a game next week.

Year 6 have had a couple of practice SAT papers this week, they asked me to start this term so we are starting gently. We will do more as the weeks go by and use homework opportunities to brush up skills. Thank you for the support you give them with these tasks at home.
