Platinum Jubilee

STEM Day



On Friday 24th September, the school rang to the sound of OOOHS and AAAHS as our STEM day got underway with an assembly by Mrs Hicks (Science and Maths Lead). The children were fascinated by a bubbles

experiment and shared their predictions for which tower of bubbles would be the biggest. After that, they spent the day exploring a range of challenges, promote Science, Technology, designed to Engineering & Maths. Hedgehog class were excited by their chocolate buttons melting 'my hand is too hot!' whilst Badger class were enthralled with the 'Egg Drop' activity. They had to create a protective capsule for their eggs and then drop them off the balcony! 'I put this in to cushion it.' Owl and Falcon classes made 'Faster Pasta' vehicles in their own rooms and 'Rocking Rollercoasters' together as a cross KS2 project. In addition, every class got to explore bubble making: which mixture was the best? How can I make bigger bubbles? What forces are acting? In all of these activities, across the whole day, it was fabulous to hear the depth of vocabulary being used in children's explanations, questions, predictions and conclusions.

The school learning skills were also very much in evidence with super collaboration in class and between classes. At the end of the day, we came together to share findings and celebrate a great day. The children overwhelmingly gave it a thumbs up!!

Year 1 Woodland School

On arriving at Basildon Park, we agreed it would be a good idea to create a shelter in case of rain as we noticed the skies were getting darker. The shelter was made with lots of keen helpers



including Alice and Isaac who then gathered leaves to make a soft pillow to place in the shelter especially for Mrs McConnell.



There had been rain earlier so Alfie and Leyla used a branch to knock the rain drops from the branches to make a shower "which felt so lovely".

The children were challenged to use string to join sticks together which we agreed is a useful skill for making things in the woods. Some children used it to make crosses and to join sticks together. Leyla won the knots challenge as she carefully tied leaves around a branch to cook in the campfire she made with Amber and Eva's help. Sofia made a collection of leaves and also worked hard to tie them up.

The den was a popular place to play; Bay, George, Dinesh, Theo and George C all enjoyed using it to play dinosaur games. Charlotte used the den as a lair for "a venomous dinosaur" explaining that it was poisonous. She enjoyed poking her head out and roaring at her playmates.

Cecily, Isaac and Eva created a fun game balancing on a log. It was like a shaky-walk -the -plank game which meant they had to balance really carefully in order to stay on.

Isaac, Alfie, Cecily and Ava enjoyed looking for objects in a pirate scavenger hunt finding leafy pieces of eight and curved branches as hooks.

At the end of the session Bay and Charlotte helped to remove the red string boundaries so that we left the woodland just as we found it...

Hedgehog class

In maths this week we have been looking at different ways of sorting and grouping objects such as buttons, socks and natural materials by looking at



colour, type and size - perhaps the children could continue this at home by pairing their own socks? We have been finding out about foods that give us energy and vitamins, and protein for healthy bones and muscles. We have even been designing our own healthy lunches by choosing from each food group.

On Wednesday we carried out a handwashing experiment with some special sparkly germ gel and a UV light - we were really surprised that it took several washes to get rid of the germs from our hands!

Badger class



Badger class have enjoyed listening to a story about a pirate called Captain Plank. They had a go at making a story map to

help them retell the main events of the story in the correct sequence. Y2 then had a go at re - writing the story and Y1 recalled their favourite parts. We wrote character descriptions about Captain Plank and discussed which parts in the story showed him as a kind character and which parts in the story showed him as an unkind character. We have been learning about nouns this week and looking at Captain Plank's pirate ship we had to search for as many nouns as we could find and list them. Y2 went on to write some noun phrases and use a comma to separate their nouns. In maths Y1 have been counting with 1-1 correspondence and comparing numbers and Y2 have been investigating tens and units with a part-whole model and then using this to develop their understanding of addition and partitioning numbers in different ways to make the same total. In computing we have been using

purple mash and exploring how to change our avatars and log on with our own usernames and passwords. All children have gone home with their login details so that they can access purple mash and continue exploring the site at home. There is a 2Do set for them so please help them to get on in order to complete the task. Many thanks

Owl class

What a hoot we have had in Owl Class this week! In English the children have completed their stories



based on The Owl Who Was Afraid of the Dark. We have had stories about tigers afraid of their tails, ducks afraid of swimming, dogs afraid of cats and sheep-dogs afraid of sheep! In the latter part of the week the children have explored non-fiction text and have become junior researchers in preparation for our forthcoming owl fact sheet writing. I am sure this unit of writing will be enriched by the wonderful experience of Sadie from Feathers and Fur visiting us with her 4 amazing owls. I am sure you have heard all about Pip and Bailey already! Place value is still the focus in maths and using this knowledge to support adding, subtracting and ordering 3 and 4 digit numbers. In science I was amazed how much the children could recall this week on how we get day and night and how shadows are formed. If you haven't done so already, ask them to explain it to you! We are still busy sewing our owls and would like to thank those of you who have offered your help.

The Falcons have been thoroughly enjoying their English studies this week, as the story of Kensuke's



Kingdom develops further. We have used drama, radio interviews, discussions and writing 'Quacks' to present our ideas. We will take a short break from the book as we look at non-fiction texts next week, aligned to our topic work. Over in Maths, the Hexagons have completed place value and are now focusing on addition and subtraction skills. The Crystals have also moved to addition and the Pentagons are completing place value as well. Please keep practicing those KIRFS as it makes all the difference! Meanwhile, we have explored and furthered earthquakes usina iellv our understanding of how/why earthquakes occur and even practised our own earthquake drill in the classroom! In Science we have continued to study forces in earthquakes but also in our experiments with air resistance - ask the children about the parachute company.....
