Owl class

We have had a lovey start back after the half term and all children seem fully refreshed and ready to learn. In



English we are using the novel 'The Boy Who Grew

Dragons' by Andy Shepherd as a stimulus for a range of writing. This week we have been thinking about descriptive language and describing our own pet dragon. Next week we will be debating if a dragon would make a good pet. In maths the Spheres have been revisiting column subtraction and exploring more than one exchange. The Cubes are also thinking about crossing tens but for addition of a 3 digit and 1 digit number. We have been using this week to finish of some of last terms learning, including our sewn owls and exploring coding to make object move, disappear and reappear on a screen. We will be munching our way into our next topic, 'Bake a Better Biscuit' from Monday!

Just a reminder that spelling books need to be in school on Mondays and reading books should be in every day. This term PE will be on Tuesday and Friday. Jewellery must be removed for all PE lessons or tape provided if earrings cannot be removed. With the cooler weather now upon us, I recommend tracksuit trousers/leggings, black is preferable and a plain sweatshirt black, navy or house colour with no large logos. Our children in Falcon class have been thoroughly enjoying learning about the COP26 conference in Glasgow. We have been gathering the skills and



facts needed to write to our MP about climate change. I have been incredibly impressed at the maturity of thought from the children. They have put their heart and soul into their letters, which we will send off to Alok Sharma. "I would like you to make a change because we're turning up the heat quickly and we need to do something about it." from Syd and "It might not affect you but it does affect me!" from Ollie. We also had a spirited debate about whether plastic products sold on behalf of the British Legion should be in school! Over in Science we have started our current topic of the circulation system and it was great to see how much the children knew about existing systems which they have studied in lower years (skeletal, digestive, muscular). Speaking of homework, the tasks set are on the Google Classroom and as we are trying to REDUCE our use of resources, a paper copy is not being given out. I look forward to seeing their projects in school! In RE we have started to consider Jesus as the Messiah and we looked at the historical background to the situation in Israel at the time of Jesus. We realized that the Messiah they wanted was very different to what Jesus was.....
