Badger class

Badger class have thoroughly enjoyed watching the short animation, "Adventures are the pits." We used it as a stimulus for their descriptive writing and have explored using exciting adjectives, writing similes and using a range of different time words to retell what happened to the boy in the ball pit. What great writers the class are becoming! As part of our DT we made party hats, thinking carefully about how to ensure they fitted, how to fasten them securely and how to decorate them following a theme. Once they are all finished, we will have a hat parade and take photos of each other. In science we have continued to explore materials and focussed on glass and plastic. We investigated how these materials can be transparent and made a pair of fun, party glasses to wear. In maths Y1 have been exploring addition and subtraction and Y2 have been looking at how addition and subtraction are inverse operations. The class are all working hard on learning their spelling or reading fish words. Please continue to support them with this and return the completed sheets in order to get the next set of words.

Our studies of 'Vetman' have continued and this week the children wrote a summary of the story so far. We have also used time in ERIC to read a biography of Noel Fitzpatrick and explored his 'Fitz for Kids' website. The class have thoroughly enjoyed finding out more about him and his work. They have already drawn parallels between his life and that of Vetman! We are excited to see where the story takes us next....

Over in 'Medical Marvels' we have explored the history of imaging, from magnifying lenses in Roman times, up to CT scanners today. The class were asked to consider which invention they felt had the most impact and then design what they thought was the next step. Mason designed a machine to read your mind, in case you can't speak and say what is wrong! Frankie suggested a colour ultrasound machine, Sam designed a Nanobot that can take a CT scan from INSIDE the body, whilst Chloe designed a very Star Trek like laser scanner! There are barely a few days until Y6 depart for Wales and a lot of excitement that this is creating. Please double check all the kit lists etc. and make sure everything is labelled!
