We did the session to parents online in the hope that more parents would be able to join us. Thank you to those who attended and apologies for presenting challenges. Sixteen parents had registered and six turned up; this is out of seventyseven families. Do you really know what your child is doing on Roblox? They say it takes a village to raise a child, so I'd like to take this opportunity to thank those parents who alert us to any concerns, so that we can support the children involved.

#### Covid plea

Covid cases in schools continue to rise and this is most definitely the case in West Berkshire primary schools. Please keep your child at home if they have symptoms, no matter how mild. They need to either isolate for 10 days or have a negative PCR test. Just like last year, the message is, "let's protect Christmas."

Should 5 children in a class contract Covid, we could well be back to online learning! Thank you to all of you that are so supportive and making decisions that protect others. You will have seen and heard plenty on the news this week about returning to slightly more restrictions. In Maths the Spheres have been working on 6 and 9 times tables and they really are becoming timetables champs! The Cubes have consolidated their understanding of adding 2 and 3 digit number crossing boundaries into 10's and 100's. We all enjoyed the theatre trip on Wednesday afternoon and this was made even more enjoyable following all our work on the Jungle Book the previous week. In History the children are starting to collate all their knowledge on Huntley and Palmers and are creating a google slide presentation with a friend. Next week we will be launching the Owl Class Biscuit Factory and making a range of biscuits and boxes for our new customers.

#### **Falcon class**

Busy, Busy, Busy!! Up here in Falcon class, we have been exploring the abstract sculptural work of Henry Moore, in readiness for making our



own Modroc abstract works of art. This has involved studying shapes and form - using volunteers covered in a body stocking! This caused great amusement, as you can imagine, but gave children the chance to sketch ideas for their work and focus on outlines and 3D shapes. We have used wire to create a 3D frame and will add more of a 3D look with paper. The Modroc application will happen next week.....so watch this space! Our Medical Marvel topic has led us to studying 'Putting Into You' and researching aspects such as blood transfusions, insulin production, anaesthetics and vaccines. A class debate then followed, using our oracy skills, and the children were split between vaccines and anaesthetics being the most important. The final task involved creating posters to promote vaccination - ironically on the day children received a flu vaccine! The theatre trip was AMAZING and we talked about the staging, costumes and characters (in readiness for our production in the summer term). Vetman continues and next week we will

write our own stories based on his adventures. We were also lucky enough to have a visit from a police officer to talk more about online safety, a very important subject for our children in this technological age. In Maths, we have been busily securing skills: Crystals - aspects of multiplication; Pentagons - multiplying and diving by 10,100,1000; Hexagons - short division.
