Headteacher's Update



We are limping our way towards the end of term. One uplifting experience of working in a primary school is seeing the excitement of Christmas among the children. It helps to keep us all going.

We have had a handful of children with Covid towards the end of term. Unfortunately, this has coincided with a sickness bug, mainly in Hedgehog and Badger classes. We usually have an outbreak every few years and this year, children's immunity has not been as high

due to the Covid isolation period last year. Nearly all have recovered quickly.



One important aspect of our work is to have regard to the health and safety of pupils and staff. This term we have not only successfully completed a comprehensive questionnaire for West Berkshire but also been scrutinised by the inspectors. One issue that remains on our agenda is the safety of pupils at the front of the school and how we can improve it. One way is to ask parents to think "child" and think "safety" and to remember not to park on the double yellow lines across the front of the school. Our thanks to all the parents who have heeded this request.

An enjoyable task for governors is our visits to school during the day, and recently Carole Print and I spent a morning in classes watching a variety of lessons. We were not only very impressed with pupil's behaviour, but also for their infectious enthusiasm for their learning; they were keen to tell us what they were studying and to show us their work. During these visits and at other times we are keen to learn what the pupils think about their school and to that end a governor has joined school council meetings to hear first-hand about their views.
