
# **Headteacher's Update**

#### **Badger class**



Badger class have been using dictionaries this week. We explored how they are written in alphabetical order and

experienced how useful this is when using a dictionary to find words. We had a go at putting words into alphabetical order and looking for

definitions of words. As part of our computing learning we have been looking at what is meant by a Binary Tree and how they can be useful for sorting data. We thought of questions to ask when constructing our own Binary Trees to sort Avatar pictures. In Science we learnt about the sun and explored different light sources. We designed sun catchers for the classroom with coloured, dark and reflective materials. Our Badgers have been thinking carefully about the different skills that they all have and how this makes them feel successful. Working with a partner they taught each other a new task and this helped them to realise how we learn best by listening to each other, asking questions, copying the learning and supporting each other. What super learners and teachers they all were!

This week the children have had a *library session* where they chose a non-fiction or a story book to enjoy at home. These books can be kept for the week and brought back into school next *Tuesday*, when they can choose another one for the week.

Next week we will be looking at the legend of Romulus and Remus. Multiplication and division is still going well in both maths groups and their times tables are coming along in leaps and bounds. In History the children have been comparing the Celts and the Romans in appearance, dress, weapons and battle approaches. They had to think carefully about why they were so different. Mrs Carr came in on Wednesday to share her wealth of knowledge on rocks and minerals with us. She was very impressed with what the children could already tell her about the three main rock types; igneous, metamorphic and sedimentary as well as what makes up the different layers of our world.

temple to Athena. Then, using their Spreadsheet knowledge, they had to cost up how many drachma they were going to need! It was great to see them applying their research and prior learning to these new challenges. In English, we are studying 'Perseus and Medusa', drawing parallels with other myths we have studied so far. Next week sees us retelling part of the story, to utilize all our narrative skills and apply the grammar we have been learning. In Maths, Hexagons continued with fractions multiplying for the HOT comparing/ordering; Pentagons challenge; consolidated their multiplication skills and the Crystals continue with their 8 times tables learning.

In the last week of term, we are planning on having a Greek festivities day, as we take part in our own Olympic Games and a feast. We will be dressing up that day, so start to think about how to make a Greek outfit. An XL tee-shirt (brown, grey or white) over leggings/skins, with a string/ribbon belt as one option.
