

Hedgehog class

In Maths this week we have been a exploring length and height, using the a vocabulary longer/taller/shorter than. We found out that a feather, a



toilet roll tube and a plastic hippo were all 3 pasta shapes long, but the crayon was shorter at only 2 pasta shapes long. We read the story of Jack and the Beanstalk and wondered how tall his beanstalk was? We thought that the beanstalk in the story Jasper's Beanstalk was much shorter.

We had an amazing time on Tuesday playing the instruments in the junk orchestra and learning to copy a rhythm. We were inspired to make our own instruments using junk materials in class and we discovered that we could make moving parts by joining materials using treasury tags and split pins.

Badger class

Badger class have been learning a class poem this week to share with the school at the poetry recital. It is called "What's floating by?" and they enjoyed putting their own actions to it and saying it with rhythm. They are very much looking forward to hearing the poems from the other classes. We have spent some time this week sharing our thoughts about how to care for the world and use our wisdom wisely to protect our environment. The class have grown in confidence to discuss with different partners and develop their oracy skills. As part of our RE we explored the idea of forgiveness and the importance of learning from our mistakes. In maths the Y1 children have been looking at place value and how to represent numbers in different ways. Y2 have looked at coins this week and totalled up different amounts. It was lovely to see so many of you in class for parents evening. I hope you liked looking around the classroom and seeing all the lovely work your children have been involved in.

For our next topic "What's in the box?" the children have been asked to prepare a **memory box** over the half term holiday, ready to bring in on their first day back. They need to be prepared to discuss their memory boxes with their friends and answer questions. This will be a great opportunity to develop their oracy skills and confidence. Owl class

What an 'owlsome' week we have had! I am overwhelmed by all the wonderful experiences we have had



and not really sure where to start! We ended last week with our family trip to Silchester Roman Town on Saturday, it was lovely to have so many of you join me for the morning. It was an enriching experience for the children to understand what life was like in our area during this period of time.

In English the children have been retelling the story of Romulus and Remus and preparing for our poetry recital telling the story of Boudicca, The Iceni Warrior Queen. The children have researched Life in Roman Britain and now have a wealth of facts. This week they will be starting to transfer this information into their own Roman Britain fact books. We will be continuing with this for the first week after half-term. Our Roman dress up day was on Wednesday; during the morning both our Romans and Celts were given the task to design a mosaic tile as new flooring for the Emperor, the results have been outstanding. Gladiator challenges at the amphitheatre proved popular during the afternoon, we had some very powerful gladiators amongst us! The day ended with a Roman banquet, our quests were served by our Egyptian Slave, The Chief Galdiator and The Empress of Calleva. They dined on cucumber, introduced to Britain by the Romans; olives, grapes, bread, dates, homed baked honey cakes prepared by Miss Turner-Hurd, and of course some wine to help was it down. The final course was a traditional Roman delicacy of sugar-coated dormice. I have attached a montage of our Roman activities at the end of the newsletter.

Thank you to everyone who has supported their children with the project homework, once again we have seen some wonderful work. This extended exploration and interaction really does enrich and deepen engagement for the children. If you didn't manage to get it all done and wish to continue during after half-term we will be continuing with the Romans for the first week back.

This week we say goodbye and good luck to Miss Turner-Hurd who had been with us this term for her final placement before stepping into the world of teaching in September.
