The story of The Boy and the Rainbow inspired us to explore mixing powder paints to create our own rainbow pictures. Layne noticed that adding black to any colour made it much darker.



We used ten frames and glass beads to record our votes for the end of day story - Elmer and the Lost Teddy won by 10:4.

We have been fascinated with how changeable the spring weather is in April and we have been carrying out a weather watch, recording our findings on a daily chart. Darcie-Clare noticed that only two days had the same weather, and they had a mix of sun, cloud and wind. We already knew symbols to use to represent sun and clouds, and Sadie suggested lots of straight lines to represent the wind.

In maths we have been playing games to be the first to 20. We have been using Numicon to record how many children are in class each day, understanding that 19 is one full ten plus nine more.

Their history learning really came to life on Wednesday when we set up the class as a Victorian classroom and had a Victorian Morning. The children entered into the role play brilliantly and learnt so much! Some said they would like to have a Victorian Morning every day! In maths Y1 have been exploring length and height and Y2 have been learning about fractions. We are trying to make secure links with fractions and division, doubling and halving.

#### **Owl class**

I hope you had a lovely Easter and enjoyed the few days of sunshine that graced us with its presence.



This term our topic is 'Cool Composers', and as the name suggests, it is all about music! We have launched out topic thinking about our personal music choices, artists and bands we enjoy and instruments we like to hear or play and created a mood board to reflect this. In English we are exploring how music is used in films and how this impacts on our own emotions. The Cubes are working with money in maths, this has been very interesting as we handle coins and notes less in our everyday life. If you can give you child an opportunity to use 'real' money when they visit the shops, count their money boxes etc, this would support their ability to recognise the coins we use. The Spheres have been adding and subtracting fractions and are doing very well. What is sound? and How do we hear? has been the big question to consider. I am sure they can you all about it!

Just a reminder that PE kits need to be in school on Tuesdays and Fridays this term and every child should have a pencil case and book bag.

WIZARD: We had a WOW start to our new topic when we not only received a message from Professor McGonagall but also had a wand workshop led by



Professor Trelawney! The children were all buzzing with excitement and there were some very practiced looking swishes of their new wands. We have started to use the first Harry Potter book as inspiration for writing in a range of genres. This week has seen us exploring a scene from the point of view of another character and writing a first-hand account - ask the children about the snake. In Maths, Pentagons and Hexagons have both been busily extending their knowledge place value and fractions, whilst the Crystals have been showing off their calculation skills. In Science we are learning about how we see, how light travels in straight lines and we used a non fiction text in ERIC to learn about refraction and rainbows. The art topic is also linked to WIZARD and the class have thoroughly enjoyed 'researching' the Harry Potter film clips to analyse the portraits in preparation for designing and making their own...watch this space! It was good to see Y5 all ready and on time for swimming this week and Mrs Fakes reported that they all worked hard in their first lesson.

Please remember to hear your children read, practice their KIRFS, times tables and spellings each day - it make a significant difference to their learning and skills. Thank you for this.
