Woodland School

As we arrived at the woods we were amazed to see how quickly the trees and plants had changed. The leaves



on the trees had appeared and were all shapes and sizes. We discovered bluebells, nettles and all sorts of new plants covering the ground. We were able to find many minibeasts and we thought this was because it was now warmer weather, which they must like. Many of us continued with our familiar activities although we also found a tree to climb which we hadn't realised we could reach before. We decided that it was because we had grown and now were tall enough to reach it! It made a brilliant look -out to spot what everyone else was doing.







Hedgehog class

This week we have been using nonfiction books and the internet to find out interesting facts about bees and other insects. We went on a bug hunt in the garden and managed to find lots of insects hiding from the rain under logs and leaves. Kylon even found a spider's nest under the climbing frame and they tickled as they crawled on our hands. We posed the question *Is a bee like me?* and we thought of lots of reasons why we are not like a bee: Sebastian noticed that we can't make honey, Dakota said that we don't have wings to make the buzzing sound, and Lottie said that we don't have 6 legs like insects. We all enjoyed making and eating the delicious oat and honey cookies - thank you bees for the honey!

Next week in Maths we will be exploring adding by counting on from a number.

Badger class



In Badger class this week the Y2's have worked especially hard and are well under way with their SAT's. Well done to

all of them showing resilience and determination to do their best. They have actually really enjoyed them and we call them "our special guizzes." As part of our History learning we have been looking at Fairy Tales and researching how they can give us information about life in the past. We were amazed to discover how the illustrations can in fact be used as excellent historical research. We have enjoyed the tale "Goldilocks and the 3 bears" and retold the story from the viewpoint of Goldilocks. Our PE this term has been to learn some country dances and the children have enjoyed learning to skip, swing and promenade with a partner. It has been great fun and very energetic. In maths Y2 have been looking at unit and non-unit fractions and Y1 have been investigating weight and mass using simple balance scales.

Owl class



This week the children have finally had an opportunity to start a global collaboration project. On Wednesday,

they met with a group of 14 children from across India and exchanged a short profile of themselves. The Indian children also delivered a presentation of their culture. Owl Class will be doing a similar presentation after the Jubilee, so we can share some of the celebrations with them. Global collaboration is such a wonderful experience for all the children and we are very thankful for all the support we

receive from The JDO Foundation to allow us to do this.

In English we have been looking at verbs, adverbs and fronted adverbials and exploring how we can use the latter two to up level our writing. The children are currently working on making predications. In maths, the Spheres are working on decimals and the Cubes are finishing a unit on money working on calculating change. In History we are continuing to research music through the ages. In small groups, the children are working on creating presentations using a range of methods and skills from the Baroque period, starting in 1600, through to the modern period ending in 1960.

We have also recommenced our Monday Mile around the village and are using this opportunity to do a spot of community work, replenishing the doggy poo bag dispensers and doing some litter picking.
