## Badger class

Enchanted Woodland." We started by sharing information about the woodland as a habitat for many different creatures and researching which animals lived in the woods near us. We made moving pictures to show some of these animals in their natural habitats, thinking carefully about creating the puppet and the appropriate background. In English we watched a short animation called "The Black Hat" and then created exciting noun phrases to describe the woodland setting. We listened to woodland sounds and used this to stimulate our writing and include all of our different senses. Such fun was had on Friday down at the field, where we enjoyed looking for minibeasts in the many microhabitats found in the wooded area. In maths Y1 have been exploring capacity and volume and Y2 have been investigating measuring using cm 's and metres.
Our PE this term is athletics and we will be going back down to the field on Wednesday afternoons. Please ensure that PE kits are in school for this lesson. With the weather getting warmer please put in shorts rather than tracksuits. Many thanks

This week in Owl Class we have been finishing off our work on Cool
 Composers. In small groups the children have been preparing a short presentation from one of the 4 main musical eras; Baroque, Classical, Romantic and Renaissance. Each group needed to research their era and then create a poster and google slide presentation detailing key composers and their most popular compositions, instruments that were popular and identify historical events from that time. Their final task was to present this to the rest of the class. I was very impressed with how well everyone did and the amount of information they included. In English the children have completed a reading comprehension and written a prediction on how our class novel; Titus Rules by Dick King-Smith will end, drawing on our knowledge of the characters and previous
events and paying consideration to the title. Once again, there has been some very impressive work. The Spheres have been exploring decimals and the Cubes have been revisiting fraction skills from the start of the year ready to move on and start finding fractions of a set. We are all very excited to be starting our new topic, Commotion in the Ocean next week.

Year 5 are having a great time camping, I popped in to see them on Thursday evening and they excitedly told me about all they had been doing. Rehearsals are going nicely and please remember to learn those lines and bring in your costume items - the costume rack is already up and filling!

This is Miss Goodban's last week with us in school, we shall miss her enthusiasm and knowledge and wish her well as she continues her studies!
