Numbers day

What an amazing Numbers Day! We started with an assembly to launch the day and the chance to see all the different roles that need numbers: landscape gardener, doctor, dentist, astronaut, chef, costume makers....to name but a few. Having heard about the history of numbers, the classes were then set some challenges to explore during the day, for example 'What's in a handful?' In Hedgehog they've

discovered that smaller hands can hold less than big hands; you can get less big cubes in one hand than small ones; sand is too tiny to count! In Badger, children found what was in their handful and then found different ways to represent that number e.g. arrays, number sentences, pictures. In Owl, children were being strategic and found that if you stack counters, you can get more in your hands; build a LEGO tower and you can hold it in your hand! In Falcon, children have designed their own new number systems with the most intriguing numerals and names. "Ours is really annoying so people may not like it!" stated Sam. As part of our DT project we have started to explore how wheeled toys work. We made caterpillars in a variety of ways using pompoms, paper chains, folded cardboard and pipe cleaners. Next week we will be looking at how to make a simple wheeled cart that can be pulled along with our caterpillars attached to the top. We are looking forward to it. The changeover day was a success all round and our Y1 rose to the challenge of being the Big Badgers and our Y2 had fun being Little Owls. Numbers Day was a fantastic opportunity to embrace maths and see just how important it is in our everyday lives. The children participated in lots of mathematical challenges over the day and thoroughly enjoyed using their mathematical skills. Exploring "What is in a handful?" opened up lots of discussion about numbers and how we could represent these numbers in many different ways.

KS1 will be 6.15pm -7.15pm and KS2 will be 7.30pm - 8.30pm


