Headteacher's Update

HOT! HOT! HOT!

Sadly, we have had to cancel the Sports Day this week. However, many other activities have taken place, with additional precautions. The local authority have released an action plan with guidance on actions that we need to consider dependent on alert level. We will keep you informed.



Pleas ensure your child has suntan lotion applied before they come to school, they have a **named** water bottle and a **named** sun hat.

Please watch out for signs of heat exhaustion. These include:

- a headache
- dizziness and confusion
- loss of appetite and feeling sick
- excessive sweating and pale, clammy skin
- cramps in the arms, legs and stomach
- fast breathing or pulse
- a high temperature of 38C or above
- being very thirsty

The symptoms are often the same in adults and children, although children may become floppy and sleepy.

Sports Week

Phew!! What a hot week! Despite the rise in temperatures, we have been able to offer a range of sports for the children over the week, thankfully most of these have been inside. On Monday we welcomed Richard Parkes from Kickfit to the school. He delivered a session, to every year group in mixed martial arts, that was linked to staying safe incorporating Stranger Danger. Tuesday the Foundation Stage through to Year 3 all had a climbing session at Adventure Dolphin, our older

children had all had a similar experience during their residentials. I believe only 5 children made it to the top and only 1 was a boy, well done to everyone who demonstrated courage during this rather challenging activity. Carl, the instructor, said 'you were all amazing!' Wednesday was our cricket day. A huge thank you to Mr Allum who gave up his day to coach the children and support in an inter-house cricket event in the afternoon. The teams were compiled of 2 children from each year group from year 1 to year 6, our cricket champions for 2022 were Earthy Bear! We found some excellent cricket talent amongst our children, which we will be building on next year. Thursday was a very popular day and all the children were buzzing after their visit to Virtue Gymnastics for a session in gym and Parkour. I certainly saw many fears being overcome on the parkour section!

Owl and Falcon class also has tennis coaching on Wednesday and Thursday morning and Greg, the coach was again very impressed by skills, attention and the resilience of our children. He has offered to run an afterschool club in the next academic year, I will give more details when I have them. Likewise I believe Purley Cricket Club are also hoping to offer the children of Purley School something similar.

I appreciate sports day being cancelled was a huge disappointment for many, but unlike most schools we do have to hold this offsite and it takes lots of organisation, equipment transportation etc prior to the event when the weather was still extremely warm and facilities at the field are extremely limited.
